Intended Use

Quantitative determination of Human IL22

General Description

ABPR-ZB120 is a solid phase sandwich ELISA for quantitative determination of Human IL22.

Reagents And Materials Provided

1. Capture Antibody: 1 mg/mL of mouse anti-Human IL22 monoclonal antibody [CABT-ZB544] (in PBS, pH 7.4).
2. Detection Antibody: 0.2 mg/mL of rabbit anti-Human IL22 monoclonal antibody [CABT-ZB907] conjugated to HRP (in PBS, 50 % HRP-Protector, pH 7.4, store at 4°C).
3. Standard: Each vial contains 8.8 ng of recombinant Human IL22.

Reconstitution And Storage

Reconstitution

1. Capture Antibody: Dilute to a working concentration of 2 µg/mL in PBS before coating.
2. Detection Antibody: Dilute to working concentration of 0.5 µg/mL in detection antibody dilution buffer before use.
3. Standard: Reconstitute with 1 mL detection antibody dilution buffer.

Storage

1. Capture Antibody: Aliquot and store at -20°C to -80°C for up to 6 months from date of receipt. Avoid repeated freeze-thaw cycles.
2. Detection Antibody: Store at 4°C and protect it from prolonged exposure to light for up to 6 months from date of receipt. DO NOT FREEZE!
3. Standard: Store lyophilized standard at -20°C to -80°C for up to 6 months from date of receipt. Aliquot and store the reconstituted Standard at -80°C for up to 1 month. Avoid repeated freeze-thaw cycles.
