BACKGROUND

Introduction	Vedolizumab (Entyvio) is a humanized antibody (IgG1/kappa), derived from a murine antibody. It is used for the treatment of both moderate to severe ulcerative colitis and moderate to severe Crohn's disease, primarily in patients who have lost response to, or are intolerant to inhibitors of tumor necrosis factor alpha (TNF α), such as infliximab, adalimumab. The drug binds specifically to human α 4 β 7 integrin, a key mediator of gastrointestinal inflammation expressed on the surfaces of T and B lymphocytes. By selectively inhibiting the binding of α 4 β 7 integrin to the mucosal addressin cell adhesion molecule-1 (MAdCAM-1), vedolizumab prevents leukocyte binding to the endothelial surface and extravasation into affected tissue. Specifically inhibiting this pathway alleviates gastrointestinal inflammation without impairing systemic immune responses.
